Preston and Sutton Poyntz Councillor News

We are very pleased that the works to resurface the roads between Coombe Valley Road and Seven Acres Road has been carried out. There are some teething issues on parts of the road which we are dealing with and we have liaised with highways staff on this matter. These works overall are a big improvement for the area and most residents we have spoken to agree.

We are now pushing for action on the pavements in this area and for re-surfacing works on Sutton Road, Cedar Drive, Willow Crescent and others. Since 2019 over a third of Prestons' roads have been resurfaced and we will continue to push for improvements.

I am also pleased that after three years of lobbying Bodkin Lane has had some flood prevention works put in which residents are pleased with especially with the over development taking place on Kingsbere Road. We have also been dealing with parking issues relating to this site with highways going out to speak with those causing the issue.

I would like to commend my town council colleagues from Preston and Sutton Poyntz for opposing the proposals contained within them which would allocate a large section of Preston and neighbouring areas for housing. At a recent Patient Participation meeting we realised patients were not aware of Enhanced Access appointments – these are appointments offered outside of normal surgery hours and may be at another GP surgery.

The NHS strategy is to get general practices working more closely together. There are now appointments (GP, nurse, and other clinicians) offered by the Weymouth Locality. This means you could be offered a sooner appointment at another GP surgery with appointments available on a Saturday morning.

Practice Merger

We are continuing to progress towards the planned merger of our practice with Dorchester Road practice, under one contract, in April 2024. Our website has a list of frequently asked questions you may find useful which we will continue to update as the merger draws closer.

Shingles Vaccine

The shingles vaccine helps protect against shingles. It's recommended for people at higher risk from shingles, including all adults turning 65, those aged 70 to 79 and those aged 50 and over with a severely weakened immune system. Shingles can occur at any age, but the risk and severity of shingles and its complications increase with age and is higher in individuals who have a severely weakened immune system.

Shingles cannot be caught from other people. Instead, it develops in people who have previously been infected with chickenpox. At least nine in ten adults are already infected with the virus that causes Shingles, having had chickenpox as children, and around one in

four people will go on to develop Shingles in their lifetime – the risk of this increases with age.

Some cases can result in serious symptoms such as blindness, hearing loss, nerve pain and potentially death, however the vaccine can significantly reduce the risk of people developing shingles and experiencing nasty symptoms.

Eligible patients will receive an invite from the surgery for their vaccination, however if you think you are eligible and have not received an invitation, please contact the surgery to book your Shingles Vaccination.

Booking your GP Appointment Online

To avoid disappointment, please note that GP appoinments which are booked online are for consultations only.

Please do not book a GP appointment online for any procedure, such as Joint Injections, Implants, Cryotherapy, Cervical Smear, Coil removal. Some procedures require more GP time and instruments and devices made ready. Please contact reception to book these appointments.

When booking an appointment online, it is helpful if you could state the reason for your appointment, i.e., pill review, hip pain. Thank you for your cooperation.

Your Pharmacy

Pharmacists can give treatment advice for a range of minor illnesses and will tell you if you need to see a doctor.

Your GP Online

Contact your GP online via eConsult on our Practice website.

Your query will be reviewed and answered by your GP within 48 hours, often the same day.

NHS 111

Go to 111.nhs.uk or call 111 if you have an urgent medical problem and you are not sure what to do. The sooner you get advice, the sooner you're likely to get better. In an emergency, go to A&E immediately or call 999.

Winter illnesses self care

Winter Illnesses are usually not serious, but they can make us feel very unwell and can make some health problems worse leading to further complications, especially for people who are more 'at risk' such as: people aged 65 and over, people with long term conditions, babies and children under 5, people on a low income, people with a disability, pregnant women, people who have a mental health condition.

Sore Throat

Symptoms of a sore throat include a painful throat especially when swallowing or a dry scratchy throat and can last 7 days without treatment.

What can I do? Suck lozenges, ice cubes or ice lollies, eat soft or cool food, gargling with salt wa-

ter can help reduce swelling and pain (children should not try this), avoid smoking, drink plenty of water, take pain relief such as paracetamol or Ibuprofen. Speak to your local pharmacy team.

When to seek help? Contact the surgery or NHS 111 if symptoms last more than 10-14 days, you have a very high temperature, you feel hot and shivery, you have problems swallowing and severe pain, you are dehydrated, you have a weakened immune system.

Cold


Symptoms of a cold are different from flu because they develop slowly and include a blocked or runny nose, sneezing, coughing, sore throat and a slight fever and can last up to 10 days.

Colds are generally harmless infections that get better in time without the need to visit the surgery.

What can I do? It is important to rest up and drink lots of fluids. Paracetamol or Ibuprofen can help with symptoms. Your local pharmacy can help with symptom relief advice.

When to seek help: Contact the surgery or NHS 111 if you have a very high temperature, feel hot and

shivery, have a long-term condition, chest pain, blood when you cough, difficulty breathing, swelling of the glands in your neck and armpits, symptoms lasting over 3 weeks.

Cough

Coughing is common. 1 in 5 people will get a cough in winter. Symptoms can last up to 3 weeks and in some cases up to 8 weeks. What can I do? Visit your pharmacist for over-the-counter medicines. Homemade remedies such as hot water with lemon juice and a teaspoon of honey can help (Not suitable for babies under 1).

When to seek help: Contact the surgery or NHS 111 if your cough lasts more than 3 weeks, you have chest or shoulder pain, blood when you cough, breathlessness, hoarseness or changes in your voice for longer than 3 weeks that continues once the cough is better, new lumps or swelling around your neck and above your collarbones.

Flu

For most people flu can cause unpleasant symptoms, but if you are in an 'at risk group' flu can cause severe illness. Symptoms of flu develop quickly and include a high temperature, aches and pains, tiredness, headache, a dry chesty cough.

What can I do?

The flu vaccine is the safest and most effective way to help protect against flu. You should rest, keep warm and drink plenty of water. Paracetamol or Ibuprofen can help with aches and pains and bring down a fever. Antibiotics do not work on flu.

When to seek help

If you are worried and your symptoms do not improve after 7 days, if you are in an 'at risk group'.

COVID-19

It is still important to be mindful of COVID-19 symptoms, which are similar to cold and flu and can include diarrhoea, feeling sick or being sick, aches and pains, blocked or runny nose, high temperature and cough, loss or change of sense of smell or taste, shortness of breath, feeling exhausted, headache, loss of appetite.

What can I do?

Most people no longer need to take a COVID test. If you are eligible, it is important to be up to date with your COVID-19 vaccinations. If you think you might have COV-ID-19, drink lots of fluids, rest, wear loose clothing, take pain relief. Antibiotics will not help. Stay at home if you have a high temperature, and do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities. Avoid contact with others.

When to seek help

Contact the surgery or NHS 111 if you are concerned about your symptoms, if you feel you can no longer manage at home, or you are worried about a child or an elderly person.

Norovirus

'The winter vomiting bug' Symptoms can appear quickly and can include vomiting and diarrhoea, slight fever, headaches, stomach cramps, aching limbs.

What can I do?

Norovirus is very contagious, so stay at home and rest. Drink lots of water to avoid dehydration. Stay off school or work until you have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days. Do phone your pharmacy for advice on how to relieve your symptoms. Do not visit the surgery. Ensure you wash your hands frequently with soap and water. Alcohol hand gels do not kill norovirus. You should start to

feel better in 2 to 3 days. When to seek help

Telephone the surgery or NHS 111 if there is blood in your diarrhoea. If you keep being sick and cannot keep fluids down. If you have diarrhoea for more than 7 days or vomiting more than 2 days. If you have a serious underlying condition such as kidney disease.

ity, have a refugee settlement worker, the travelling community, help to maximise incomes, work face to face, via email, telephone and letters. Many of their clients are not IT literate which currently can bring its own problems. Many organisations help to fund the Bureau including Dorset Council, Local Authority, Wessex Water, Health Service, Food Banks and other groups. Rachel brought a room temperature guide and leaflets for each of our members. There were many questions from the floor including one on the recently received fuel allowance to pensioners. We were told that if this allowance was not needed and members wished to donate it, the Dorset Community Foundation will happily accept any donation and pass on to others in need. The Bureau has an extremely large website content which is open and available to anyone. This was a most interesting and informative talk and Rachel was warmly thanked for attending.

Ideas were shared regarding our pre-Christmas coffee morning on 21st November to which everyone is invited and made very welcome. That includes you! Put the date in your diary, 10.00 – 12 noon. Plenty of stalls, homemade cake, coffee and tea at The Church Rooms, Preston, just opposite St Andrew's Church. Easy parking. You will be made very welcome.

The walking group continues to thrive together with a craft group, a singing group and two book clubs. Skittles has restarted after the summer break. 



In the closing weeks of the year and as Christmas approaches it is only natural that our thoughts should turn to...sheep. Or to one sheep in particular.

Now anyone, like me, who comes from, or for that matter stays in, Wales, will have a soft spot for sheep. This is because there are so many of them that they are often considered to be one of the family. The Welsh are not alone in this feeling for I believe that Portland has the same affinity for these woolly covered mammals, Portland sheep being one of the oldest breeds in the UK. And in New Zealand the ratio is about five sheep for every person, which seems a trifle excessive. But I digress.

It was upsetting to learn that one Scottish sheep in particular spent last Christmas, and perhaps the one before that, all on its own. This happened because it became stranded at the foot of an isolated sea cliff in the Cromarty Firth. The area is difficult to access from the landward side because of the 250 feet (that's roughly 76 metres) cliffs and the gorse, bracken and fencing that gets in the way. A bit like the Coast Path I imagine.

Anyway, if like me your knowledge of geography in general, and Scottish geography in particular, is a bit lacking I can reveal that Cromarty Firth is a sea inlet on the east coast just below Invergordon. Hope that makes it clear. The sheep, let's call her Dolly, was first discovered by kayakers who were paddling along the coast as long ago as 2021. Not the most hospitable place to paddle. When I had a canoe I had

trouble launching it at Overcombe Corner, but Jillian, one of the kavakers, must be made of sterner stuff. Jillian says that Dolly followed them as far as she could along the rocky shoreline before turning back, bleating all the while. Recently Jillian returned, to observe that Dolly was still there, more than a full year later, and that her fleece had grown much longer and was now dragging on the ground. Until we can find an interpreter who speaks Baa (the universal language of sheep) we don't know if Dolly is bleating to request help or shouting 'Go away. This is my part of Scotland'. But assuming the former, various official organisations have been contacted and drones (do you think that a drone is named after the noise it makes?) have been used to capture pictures of Dolly. Which is a bit unfair, as she is probably not looking her best at the moment. The Cairngorm Mountain Rescue Team and the SSPCA (work that out for yourself) both seem to say that unless Dolly lets them know directly that she requires assistance they won't be able to help. Something to do with GDPR - General Data Protection Regulations - or PPS - Preserving the Privacy of Sheep. The Coastquard are not too interested and the RNLI don't seem to have been involved. But BHC (the British Hovercraft Company) have volunteered one of their vessels and are seeking funding for the crew's 1,400 mile round trip. Sounds as though they must be based in West Bexington. So if you have a big garden and would like to help by offering Dolly a safe

place to graze after the rescue, let me know and I'll pass on your offer. But I digress again, for what had really caught my eye was the news or was it Al generated false information, let's hope so - the news that the art of handwriting is in serious decline. 

Citizens Advice

Q: I like shopping online and I'm always on the lookout for a bargain, especially with the festive season coming up, but I'm worried about scammers. How can I avoid getting caught out?

A: While scams can be tricky to recognise there are steps you can take to protect yourself from falling foul to a scammer.

Remember, if it seems too good to be true then it probably is. If you're buying from a site you haven't used before, do some research

before hitting buy. Find the company's return and refund policies so you know your rights if something goes wrong. You should also look up the company's address: this can normally be found in the website's 'contact us' section and should include a street name, not iust a post office box.

Take some time to see what other people have said about the website. Look at different review websites, don't just rely on reviews the company has put on its own

Scammers will often ask you to pay in unusual ways, or put you under pressure to buy, so be wary of people contacting you out of the blue offering an item for a quick sale or special deal.

If you do fall victim to a scam, don't feel ashamed. Scammers are clever and regularly adapt their methods making them harder to spot. And do report it, as this alerts authorities to scammers' techniques and prevents others from being taken advantage of.

You can report a scam to Citizens Advice or Action Fraud. If you've transferred money in the last 24 hours contact the police via the non-emergency number

however if you feel unsafe use 999. You should also contact your bank to let them know you've transferred money.



DC cabinet members about our bus service. I find these conversations difficult within Dorset Council because frankly compared with the rural areas we appear well served. However, we have fewer cars per head of population in Weymouth and Portland, lower wages and greater need.

Although when comparing timetables our bus service looks good the time table does not show the number of buses cancelled, running late or full up. For example, waiting at Foords Corner for a bus to Weymouth I counted six travelling to Portland. After almost an hour one appeared travelling to Weymouth, but of course it was full! Is the Bermuda Triangle lo-

cated on the Island?

When the buses are fully staffed they run well, I believe a recruitment drive is well under way so I hope we will see an improvement because when it is bad it is horrid. Mayoral activities have been busy I am still trying hard to support local community groups. I had great fun during Parliament week hosting young people in the new Town Hall. 

Hovis' listed building brought back to former glory

A listed building on one of Dorset's most iconic streets has been transformed and bought back into residential use, thanks to collaborative work between the owner and Dorset Council.

The formerly derelict cottage on Gold Hill in Shaftesbury, featured in the renowned Hovis advert 50 years ago and has now been removed from the council's at risk register.

The Grade II cottage, built in the 17th Century or early 18th Century had lain empty, unused and in disrepair for five years.

Dorset Council's Housing Standards team, which specialises in bringing empty homes back into

use, managed to trace the previous owner and explored possibilities for the cottage's future.

The council helped to quickly bring the property to market and in 2021, it attracted widespread national interest at an online property auction.

Working closely with the new owner, officers have given tailored News continued on page 23

conservation advice and guided the restoration from day one, resulting in a building that is functional and complimentary to the past and for the future.

This transformative project recognises the history and heritage of the area and has preserved the site for future generations. Owner Dexter Parsons has sensitively renovated the cottage, saving many original features. He has used traditional building materials and techniques to preserve the historical fabric and make a home fit for modern living.





How do you say that? Or rather, when did we do that? Advent, the four weeks lead-

ing up to Christmas Day, used to be one of the two periods the Church could not marry you. If you are lucky enough to have records of your ancestors going back a long way, you quite often see their weddings on December 26th, or at the end of Lent, the other period without Church masses.

Most of us have the feeling that Christmas fever starts earlier every year. I like to resist it till after Remembrance Day, but with mince pies in the shops year-round it's hard. Our forefathers didn't start Christmas till much later, but they finished it later too... Old Christmas is now our January 6th, Epiphany, for reasons too complicated to go into here. And Christmastide finished at Candlemas, 2nd February, by which time your evergreens need to be out of your house. It's a long time, but the days were short, dark and cold, and both humans and farm animals would rather stay in and eat their food stores.

So have a happy Christmas and New Year (which also used to start much later... at the end of March!) and may you and your loved ones have as much light, warmth and food as you wish.
